- We are doing very well. All of our events this year have been in the black

### Athletic Director Report—Kyle Schuyler

- Four girls from the golf team competed at Regionals at Fox Hill. None qualified for State.
- Girls' tennis competed at Regionals at Quail Courts. None qualified for State, but 3 or 4 teams participated in playback games.
- Lacrosse lost a tough one to Golden in the playoffs, but really put the first-year program on the map.
- Boys' swim and dive had an unbelievable 5th win at Conference Championships. Our conference includes 4 of the top 7 teams in the state. The team qualified 19 for State.
- Both boys' and girls' track and field placed third at the Conference Meet. Twenty-six athletes are headed to State after a great second half of the season.
- Girls' soccer is seeded eighth in the State Tournament. They have made quick work of their first two opponents in the tournament and likely should have been seeded higher.
- Baseball has only lost 2 games this year, both of them out-of-state. They swept Longmont and are

expected to be #2 or #3 seed for Regionals which means that we will probably host the first round on Saturday. It is possible that the boys will be playing on Graduation Day.

- Best of luck to all the teams and individuals as they compete in the post-season!

### **Principal's Report—Erick Finnestead**

- We are hiring a volleyball coach (new health teacher), and Coach Ashlee of girls' basketball will be joining us as a science teacher.
- The two new math teachers are coming out of student teaching.
- Ten students have qualified via NMSQT and 14 students have completed very high-level AP research projects. He is very pleased with the academic accomplishments of our students.
- We are piloting a new program Eye to Eye for mentoring special education students at Altona. We will be sending kids to Brown for training for this important leadership opportunity.
- Into the Woods was wonderful and enjoyed by the 5th graders from our feeders.

- Thanks to those who attended the Volunteer Appreciation Event. Unfortunately, turnout was very low. She expressed her appreciation to everyone who volunteers for RABC!
