Call to Order Kaydene Hubert at 6:35 PM

Athletic Director Report – Kyle Schuyler — Winter Sports Round-Up

- Unified Basketball—Last game vs. Longmont Police Department tomorrow (2/26).
- Girls' Swim and Dive placed in the top 5 at States without having a home pool. Centennial Pool will probably not be open until April for Boys' Swim and Dive.
- Boys' Basketball will take on Ponderosa on Wednesday in the first round of the playoffs.
- Wrestling had three wrestlers make it to the second day at Regionals, with one wrestler finishing one spot off the podium and another two places off.
- Cheer finished 14th at Nationals in Orlando. They just missed advancing to the Finals. Thanks to Jen Orvis for pulling off this opportunity of a lifetime for the girls.
- Dance is going to perform at Creek Week. Thanks to Sheryl and Shelanie for stepping in and helping to keep this program going while the search for a coach goes on. The girls choreographed their own routines and performed at halftime of five basketball games and put on a great dance camp.
- Spring Sports are sponsoring tryouts now and practices begin soon. Track and Field has over 80 students out and Girls' Golf has 10.
- Kyle noted that he tweets out information about events every day. Follow him to know more about the going on at Silver Creek.

Guest Speaker: Emma Gibbs (Student Leader—Raptor Activity Leadership Council [RALC])

- Emma and her brother noticed that school spirit has declined. She picked up RALC, which was created three years ago by Erin Sargent, as her Capstone. Emma would like to create continuity in this organization from year to year.
- Emma has a master schedule of all events (sports, music, etc.).
- The goals of RALC are: 1) to help students to know what is going on; 2) to get students with different interests (A Wing vs. F Wing) to interact; and 3) to use personal connections to get kids to come out and support each other's events.
- RALC has tried to incentivize attendance with free food.
- RALC is also sponsoring the Raptor Bowl, where teams receive a certain number of points for attending events. The team or club which accumulates the most points (by logging attendance on a Chromebook at the events) will earn a prize at the end of the year.
- RALC is supporting Money for Miracles on March 14, another SCLA Capstone project to raise

money for leukemia, at Girls' Tennis.

- Stay tuned for an upcoming BBQ in conjunction with Baseball and Girls' Soccer.
- RALC would like to work together with RABC. RABC can help promote the Raptor Bowl. We could offer a free food voucher for Concessions, SCHS gear, or a treat to the first five kids at an event. Kids will bring their friends. We could help encourage students to attend one of the twice monthly RALC meetings and to follow RALC on Twitter (@THE_RALC)
- RALC has struggled with promotion because the District has restricted where and how big posters can be.
- RALC would be willing to help create a pep squad for RABC.

Committee Reports

After-Prom—Lora Noesen

- We will need more than 60 volunteers and would like to have the slots filled before Spring Break. There will be carnival games to run in pairs, as well as giant jenga.

Upcoming Presentation—Kaydene Hubert

General Funds Requests—Kaydene Hubert

- We received two requests—one from Girls' Golf for jackets and the other from Track and Field for a replacement top pad for the high jump pit.
- We are going to temporarily table the request from Girls' Golf because RABC bought them 10 sets of coats, pants and gloves/mittens in 2015. Kyle is trying to locate these. If they are found, we encourage Girls' Golf to request something else.
- Coach Riel is requesting through Sara Hinklin \$1945 for a replacement top pad for the high jump pit for Track and Field. The old one is falling apart and is a safety issue. Track currently has \$2757 in its RABC account and has a pancake breakfast fundraiser coming up. They currently have 12 members out of ~80 participants. We would like to boost that percentage.
- Cherese has a request from Girls' Tennis that just came in. They would like \$620 total to buy—bands (power systems) so they have enough to go around (\$307), 10 tube systems to pick up balls (\$138), a portable speaker (\$150), and a floor exercise agility ladder (\$25). These things can be used for Boys' Tennis as well.
- RABC has \$3000 for GF requests. We encourage all programs and coaches to apply.
- No objections to a voice vote on the GF requests on the table.
- Track \$1945 for replacement top pad for high jump pit—approved, none opposed
- Tennis \$620 for bands, tubes, speaker, and ladder— — approved, none opposed
