Treasurer's Report — Amy Kim (rabc treasurer@gmail.com)

- We have had a very successful year with income well over budget. We are still waiting on a \$1,500 check from the Student Senate for their portion of After-Prom.
- For the proposed 2018-19 budget, Amy went off the actual budget from this year. She noted again that this was a successful year, so the budget next year might end up different. Kaydene indicated that we will vote on our proposed budget at our August meeting.
- Amy requested that all outstanding expenses be submitted by 6/1/18 in order to close the books at the end of the fiscal year, 6/30/18. This is for all large expenses.
- Amy asked that folks email her if they are expecting a check and don't receive one. It could be a missed signature or something that is holding it up.

Athletic Director Report – Kyle Schuyler — Spring Sport Conference Championships Are Coming Up

- Varsity baseball has two more games and must win both to make Conference playoffs.
- Girls' soccer has not lost yet.

Committee Reports

After-Prom—Kaydene Hubert

- This year's event held at The Wild Game made its goals in terms of donations and volunteers, but the number of students attending was down. This is probably because the prom was held at the Denver Aquarium. We are going to try to push for a local prom through Cindi Lindsey (staff) who heads up the Prom Committee, so that kids will eat here and support local restaurants. One idea is the Shupe Homestead.

Raptor Run—Robin Lee and Stacy Koelfgen

- As usual, the weather was cold and wet. It appears to be a tradition. This may be why we did not see growth in our number of participants despite much more effort. About half of our runners were race day registrants and about 1/8 were repeat runners from last year. We need the support of our own community here at Silver Creek. The race timer said that usually 60% to 70% are from the organization, not the case with us.
- We were very successful with sponsorships—Extra Innings, Red Line Athletics, Rez Rents, Foster Chiropractic, the Wild Game, Club Pilates—as well as generous prize donations from our local community.
- We raised \$2,190 mostly from sponsorships after covering our fixed costs.
- A big thank you to everyone who helped!
- Taylor Hammeren suggested making it more fun—a color or bubble run with a BBQ to follow.
- Kaydene indicated that Michael Cimperman has proposed moving the race to the Fall.

Concessions—Kaydene Hubert

- Tamara and Laurie have done a great job this year. Tamara will stay. As a bonus, her husband Martin goes above and beyond to help her and us.
- We do need a new scheduler to replace Laurie. This can be done from home and involves entering games and teams to work in a spreadsheet. The first home football game is 8/25.
